

Electrocardiograph **Technician Program**

About the Program

Texas A&M International University's Office of Continuing Education Electrocardiograph (EKG) Technician training program consists of 40 hours of classroom study and lab practice in preparation for the certification exam. Students will gain both theoretical and practical training, learning the skills necessary to perform electrocardiography testing from machine operation to reading graphs. The subjects covered in this course include:

- EKG unit operation and troubleshooting
- 12-lead electrode placement
- Recognizing and interpreting normal and abnormal EKG patterns
- Plotting EKG axis
- · Anatomy and Physiology of the Cardiovascular system
- Electrophysiology
- Review for the Electrocardiograph Technician Certification (CET) exam

Students who successfully complete this program will be awarded a Certificate of Completion by the University.

How to Register

Admission to the program is based on a review of the application and interview with the student. In order to complete the application and be considered for admission, students must:

- Complete all registration, enrollment, and student agreement forms
- Provide high school transcripts, GED scores, or college transcripts
- Submit to a complete background check. Applicants who have been convicted of any felony or drug-related crime will not be admitted to the program.

Additional prerequisites include:

- Basic algebra, computer and typing skills (25-30WPM)
- Commitment to a rigorous course schedule.
