CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION:

To participate in the **Hispanic Student Success Initiative**, the candidate must meet the following eligibility criteria. Eligible candidates will be selected by committee.

A. Minimum requirements:

- Candidate must be a high school graduate or must have earned a GED;
- Candidate must have a grade average of 85 or better upon graduating from high school;
- Candidate must meet Texas Success Initiative (TSI) satisfied;
- Candidate must have received a letter of acceptance from Texas A&M International University or Laredo Community College;
- Candidate must declare he/she is an Education major;
- Candidate, if attending Laredo Community College, must declare he/she will be transferring to Texas A&M International University upon completing his/her coursework from LCC;
- Candidate must sign release form allowing the use of his/her writing data, grades, etc., to be utilized as part of the research being conducted through the **Hispanic Student Success**Initiative project;
- Candidate must commit, in writing, to fully participate in all activities related to the **Hispanic Student Success Initiative** project;
- Candidate must have completed the FASFA

B. Preferred Qualifications:

- Candidate must have been a member of the **Texas Association of Future Educators**; **Ready**, **Set**, **Teach**; or other similar organization;
- Candidate, if declaring to be a Bilingual Early Childhood Education major, must be bilingual in the English/Spanish language and must have completed, at a minimum, 3 semesters of high school Spanish classes;

C. Other Requirements:

- Candidate must submit a 300-word typed essay on the subject of "The Importance of Being a Teacher;"
- Candidate must agree to an interview with the selection committee;
- Candidate must present, if necessary, two letters of support from individuals that have known him/her for a minimum of 3 years (individuals writing letter of support must not be related to the student in any way).
