Dr. Arenaz: University Update

-Chancelor Century Council video

-Board meeting: Length of time in Texas to get a new degree approved. The THECB (Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board) causes some of the slowdown. They are looking at ways to streamline the system policy so that degrees get approved more quickly.

-Stackable and microcredentials. **Texarkana** is looking at this type of credentialing. We need to renew our discussions about this. **West Texas** is launching an associate degree (progress degree). THECB approved 7 associate degrees in different areas (completion of 60 hours).

-CEO meeting was uneventful. In April, we will present our budget for next year.

-Concern about changes in Title IX, but nothing yet

-State of Texas is predicting 18-billion-dollar surplus. This is a HEAF (Higher Education Assistance Funds) reauthorization session.

-Discussion about increasing tuition/fees and affordability. We do not have differential tuition. Our published rate is what students in any major pay.

-Still experiencing issues with FAFSA

-Possible legislation concerning graduates who do not pay their student loans. Universities may be responsible for a portion.

-TELUS has gone live

-Board of Regents is doing an organization and structure of governance review.

-A new policy is pending about proper use of university email

-Discussion about nursing shortage. It is difficult to grow programs when there is limited faculty and clinical space.

-Update on SB 17. We are going through the audit process this spring.

-Our construction project has been approved (Health Sciences Building and expansion of WHT). Groundbreaking will be April 5 (Health Sciences).

-Increase in student health fee was approved.

-TAMIU will develop Clinical Lab Sciences and Physical Therapy programs.

-LAR-For this session, it will be civil engineering and computer science.
