



## Advanced Placement

Examinations offered by the Advanced Placement Program are administered during late spring by high schools. Students usually take the examinations after completing AP courses, although experience in an AP is not required. Interested students should contact their high school counselors for information concerning registration and test sites. High school students and currently enrolled students should have the College Board forward their scores to the University's Office of the Registrar. AP scores of entering freshmen are generally received in late July.
